The initiative connects CYCWs, mentors and other programme staff to children through phone calls, texts and WhatsApp groups.

In just five weeks, the mentor team of 27 people have logged 3,257 calls to children and youth.



1,500 Children & Youth



So far, 114 virtual groups have been created with more than 1,000 children and youth.

Since the lockdown.

1,424 virtual group sessions
have been done reaching these 1,000 children
at 13,802 different times.

The activities include

- Informing them of the covid-19
- Reminding them of good hygiene practices
- Doing a child protection/safety check-in
- Reminding them to focus on their school work
- Study sessions/other educational support
- Grade 12 support groups
- Reading groups
- Debates
- Vhutshilo sessions
- Poetry, chess, musical activities
- Discussions on social issues: such as gender-based violence and substance abuse
- Other fun activities that can be done in their homes.





The Isibindi Ezikoleni Free State and KwaZulu-Natal team

also receives assistance from educators for the virtual study sessions.
